

Our Beloved Masako Hiramatsu





Born in 1933 as the eldest of 4 siblings, in Kagawa. A graduate from Tokyo Woman's Christian University and also completed a Master's program at Tokyo Metropolitan University in 1964.

After working at the radio division of the US embassy in Japan,

Masako has joined Radio Kanto as a broadcast journalist. She then covered the Vietnam War as the first Japanese female reporter to be dispatched overseas.

Masako served as the President of BPW Japan 3 times since 1995. She has also served as the Chair of Environment Committee for IFBPW, leading her to join the World Environment Summit in Johannesburg in 2002. As the iconic figure of BPW Japan, she is one of the top reasons for many members to join the sisterhood. Her attraction did not stop only within BPW, but also over all other women's NGOs in Japan, politicians, and even the government officials such as MOFA and generations of Gender Equality Bureau in Cabinet Office. Masako introduced many of the main BPW programs in Japan including EPD, Young Speech Contest, GGGI seminars, and the CSW internship, which empowered many younger generations for decades.







In order to keep "fighting" for women, she played tennis with her personal coach weekly, always went out to meet new people, and of course to enjoy good food with beer, until just before being admitted to hospital for a thorough check on her back pain in July 2021. She actively joined the online meetings and events while being bedridden, and even managed to be allowed some beer on Nov 18th. Masako has lost her battle on Nov 30th, surrounded by her family in the hospice facility. She is survived by 2 younger sisters, a younger brother, nieces and nephews who supported throughout her 88 years' life full of great achievements and influences.

To ensure BPW continues to thrive and to achieve a level of transparency, inclusiveness, and diversity we need to create new opportunities to work and support each other even if our voices, thoughts, and goals might be different. Research shows to bring women onto Boards we need women leaders to provide a hand up, not shut and bolt the door. Our region is one of the most diverse and our



cities have some of the highest cultural populace, we need to use this to our strength and find ways to open new forms of communication, connectiveness and growth.

My BPWNZ experience has been varied from club to Executive level, including issues and membership; spoken at governmental select committee hearings; issued media press releases; radio and TV interviews; and been an international speaker. Keynote speaker to Women in Construction events and invitation to be on the YWCA Best Practice Pay Equity Awards Panelist (corporations leading equal pay from the top). Had been a delegate leader and alternative delegate and/or speaker at seven of the eight congresses/regional meetings and Oceania sub-regional events from 2008-2017. Had developed strong projects including, as BPWNZ President, the establishment of the BPWNZ/UN Women and Human Rights Commission partnership for WEPs in 2011.

At an International level my work has been varied; including Constitutional Advisory Committee (CAC) member (2014-17 and 2018-21), have been a D20 delegate at the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women (CSW) and part of the NZ delegation that worked strongly on the Agreed Conclusions, and a speaker at two events:

BPW NZ, Ministry for Women, New Zealand Foreign Affairs & Trade: "Women on the frontline in localizing SDG 11: Sustainable Cities and Communities, speaker (NZ Permanent Mission, 2019)

Women for Water, Role of Diplomacy, speaker, (Netherlands Permanent Mission, 2015)

Other roles for BPW International included Parliamentarian at the International Board meeting (2020) and Parliamentarian Chair for the online General Assembly (GA) March 2021. Held the position of Sub-Regional Coordinator for Oceania (2017-2021), and developed a report based on what our region required to ensures its sustainability, this provides a basis to move forward. Post the GA was invited to accept the role for a second term (2021-24).

To ensure no conflict of interest, I requested that both the International President and Regional Coordinator were comfortable with my standing as Sub-Regional Coordinator for Oceania again, based on being appointed the new Constitutional Advisory Committee (CAC) Chair for 2021-24. Both agreed no conflict of interest. personal/Professional Statement: As a Registered Architect and a NZ Green Star Accredited Professional, I have a strong drive to develop environmentally sustainable developments and buildings for the future.






